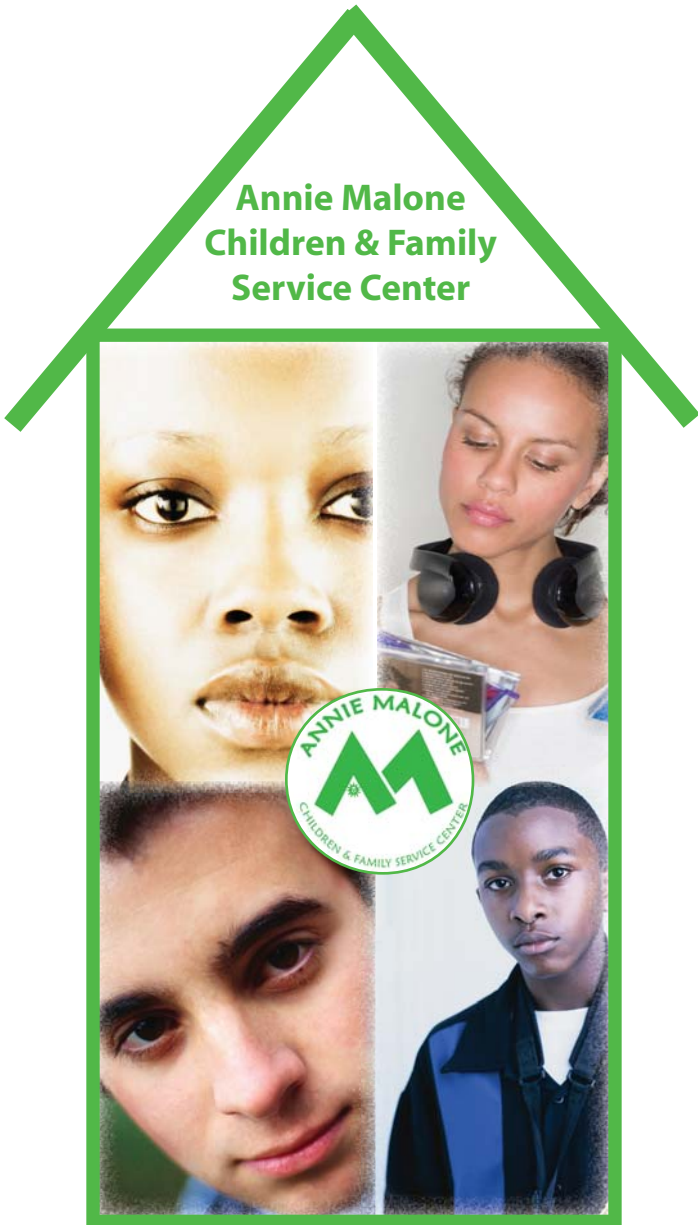

Mission

The mission of Annie Malone Children & Family Service Center's Transitional Living Program is to provide experiences for young people ages of 16 and 21 that enhance their skills and abilities to successfully transition from out of home placements to self sufficiency and achieve independent living.

Residents share a two or three bedroom apartment in a newly renovated facilities. Services include:

- Career planning and development
- Home management skills
- Employment retention
- Individual counseling
- Budgeting
- Financial Management
- Decision-making
- Problem-solving skills



Site Locations

The Transitional Living settings at Annie Malone are comprised of two separate programs serving 14 youth.

The scattered site program is located in a four (4) unit brick building. There are two apartments on the first floor and two apartments on the second floor, with individual rear exits. Each apartment has two separate bedrooms, a kitchen with stove and oven, a refrigerator, a bathroom, washer, utility closet for the heating and water units, living room area, and storage area.



The group home program is located in a five (5)-story brick building renovated in 1991. It has independently accessible apartments on each floor. Each apartment can accommodate three (3) young people (between the ages of 16-18). Youth will have their own bedroom which has a twin sized bed, dresser, night stand, desk, chair, and closet. The apartment also has a washer and dryer, stove, and refrigerator in the kitchen area.



Program Goals

The primary goal of the Transitional Living Program is to expose participants to independent lifestyles while providing them supportive services to ensure they achieve self-sufficiency.

The program is designed to provide ample opportunities for practical application of skills learned.

Specific Program Goals

- Increase knowledge and skills in home management.
- Develop job, career search and retention skills.
- Increase knowledge of community resources.
- Improve the ability to obtain documentation necessary for receipt of educational, vocational, and financial services.
- Improve basic living skills such as hygiene, healthcare, housekeeping, and meal planning.
- Improve money management skills.
- Develop more effective oral and written communication skills.
